GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Trick shots look impressive but take a lot of practise and patience. Create your own trick shot and then perfect it until it works.

A trick shot involves a person completing a shot in an impressive way. For example it might be kicking a football into a bin across the garden, throwing a pen into a mug from across the room, bouncing a table tennis ball into a glass via some upside down pans or throwing a tea bag into a mug from a long distance.

There are many trick shot videos online to help give you ideas.

GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Capture the start of a new day, with a sunrise time-lapse.

Some of the most impressive parts of the day are the sunrise and sunset, marking the start and end of each day.

As part of your daily walk, go and find a great spot to capture the sunrise. Think about where the sun will rise and what scenery you'll get in the shot too. Many smart phones now have a time-lapse function. If yours doesn't then download a time-lapse app. Alternatively you could take a series of photos of different parts of your local area during sunrise. Get some inspiration for your time-lapse by looking at different sunrise photos and videos on Google.

Enjoy a lie in too much to capture a sunrise? Capture a sunset instead.

GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

To help celebrate VE Day, take yourself back 75 years to WWII, by watching a film based around the war and then reviewing it afterwards.

This year marks 75 years since VE Day, when World War II ended in Europe. Since then, many films have been made looking back at the events of WWII. Watch one of those films. Some suggestions of film are: Dunkirk, Saving Private Ryan, Hacksaw Ridge, Midway, Fury, The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas.

After watching the film, write a short review of the story and how it portrayed WWII. You might want to think about the story that was told, what life was like for the characters, how you think you would cope if you were in that situation and how it made you feel watching it. Your film review could be a written one, but you could also make a collage or record a video.

GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Celebrate the 75th anniversary of VE Day (8th May) by holding a party with your family.

VE Day this year marks 75 years since the end of World War II. In 1945, VE Day was a big celebration with the whole country happy that the fighting was over. There were street parties across Britain.

If we weren't in lockdown, then street parties and other celebrations would have been taking place this year to celebrate 75 years. Hold your own celebration at home with a mini 'street party' just for your family. You could decorate the house with homemade bunting, wear red, white & blue, prepare food for a tea party, play some family games together, learn a wartime song or give three cheers for all the soldiers who fought in World War II.

Why not hold the party in your front garden or driveway if you have one, and encourage your neighbours (you could put a note through their door) to do the same to help create a street celebration, suitable for these social distancing times?

One thing we are certainly not short of at the moment is news. News programme viewing figures and website visits are much higher than normal, as the UK looks for fresh information about the Coronavirus situation. Learn some journalist skills, by interviewing a family member and creating your own headlines about lockdown.

First, you'll need to interview a family member. Think about what questions you'd like to ask them. It might be about how they are coping with life in lockdown, how the situation has impacted their school/work life, what it has been like spending so much time together as a family etc.

Now write up or record your news article. If writing it up, you could create a newspaper's front cover with your headline and story. Alternatively record a news video which could be included as part of a TV news show.
